



### VCC Quarterly Summary from our projects are as follows:

The fall quarter of 2019 was very busy for VCC General Contractor Inc. It pursued the construction projects In Wemindji, such as the Wemindji Arena, the construction of the five (5) units (Pike houses), the Justice Facilities renovation as well as other housing projects. In Wemindji, VCC General Contractor Inc. started the operation of the concrete plant. Tawich Construction Inc. and VCC General Contractor Inc. are partners and both invested together in the concrete plant project. And, VCC will continue to build our working relationship with our sister company TCI.

In other communities of Eeyou Istchee and Nunavik, VCC General Contractor Inc. and its partners also worked on major projects.
